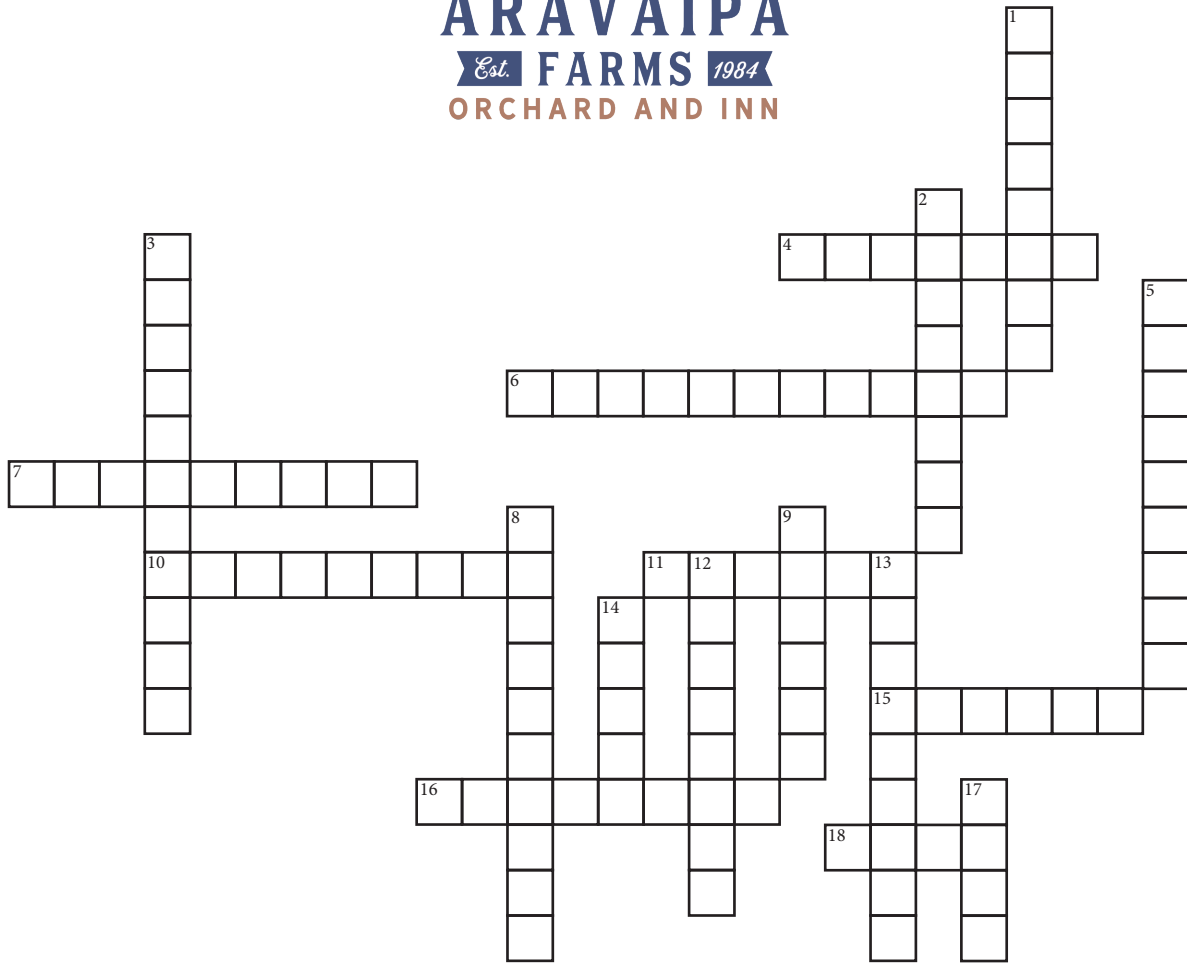




**ARAVAIPA**
